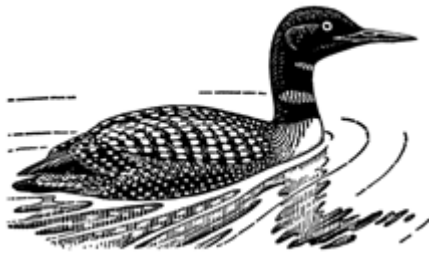

Polish-American artist Adam Grant, Master Figure Painter

Adam (Grochowski) Grant began painting in Warsaw but ultimately Toledo became his home. A survivor of Nazi concentration camps, his paintings demonstrate his fascination with human conditions ranging from destruction to rebirth. The classical nude became his forte, along with acrobats and musicians, revealing his humor, soulfulness, and dramatic flair.

Historic Photographs

June 13, 20, and 27 (3 weeks)

Since the invention of photography in the 1800s, people have used cameras to capture moments in time that are invaluable to historians. In this course we will look at both the development and accessibility of photographic technology and the ways in which historic photographs can be interpreted (or misinterpreted) by today's researchers. Consideration will also be given to digital preservation and search methods available in the 21st century.

Dr. Myers has a doctorate in history and has taught at Franklin University as well as many popular Lifelong Learning classes.

Introduction to Ceramics

This course will introduce you to the medium of ceramics, focusing on hand-built methods (rather than using a pottery wheel). Learn about different varieties of clay, tools, and methods of construction as you create your own pinch and coil pots, slab-built platters and bowls, and decorative household items.

- 6/14 Lesson: Good studio practices, clay bodies, wedging, tools. Projects: pinch and coil pots
- 6/21 Lesson: Slab rolling and joining. Projects: slab bowls and platters, soap dish/trivet/candle holder/coasters
- 6/28 Lesson: Molded bowls and bisque firing. Projects: molded forms and clean up of other projects
- 7/12 Lesson: Glazing. Project: Glaze bisque ware

Shipwrecks of Lake Erie – Fire, Storm, Collision

Lake Erie has perhaps the largest concentration of shipwrecks per square mile of any body of water in the world. From the 1700's to the present a variety of military and commercial vessels have been lost on her waters. The talk explores wreck types with their stories in chronological order.

You'll be transported to some of the largest observatories in the world, as well as learn about recent NASA missions including the Hubble Space Telescope.
